






Figure 3. Estimated number of adults incarcerated for drug law violations in the United States, 1972—2002





MUCH MORE LIKELY TO BE ARRESTED FOR MARIJUANA POSSESSION THAN WHITE PEOPLE




- ✓ Voters feel very cool toward marijuana.
- ✓ Voters believe *marijuana laws* waste public safety resources that could be dedicated to combatting violent crime.
- ✓ Voters like new revenue for education, health care, and treatment – especially from a "sin tax."
- ✓ Voters like the idea of taking money away from gangsters.

Treating marijuana use as a crime has failed. It's time for a new approach.










