

SEMINAR INFORMATION NOTE

DATES, VENUES AND FORMAT OF THE SEMINAR

The Seminar will take place in the Houses of Parliament, Westminster from Monday 3 – Wednesday 5 November 2014. It is hoped that up to 100 participants will take part in the Seminar, including Parliamentary Delegates, Guest Speakers, UK Parliamentarians, Civil Society representatives and academics.

The Seminar Programme will commence at 13.00 on Monday 3 November with Registration of Delegates and the Opening Session. The Programme will continue with a series of plenary, workshop and panel sessions, until the afternoon of Wednesday 5 November for the Closing Session.

All panels and sessions will be interactive, with ample time for debate after the initial presentations. Participants should make every effort to avoid reading formal statements. Instead, they are invited to ask questions and participate in the debate by making brief statements and comments. No formal list of speakers will be drawn up in advance, with the order of interventions and questions to be decided by the Chair or Moderator.
