Through knowledgeable and caring support, **halow** 's Supported Living service ensures young people are empowered to live the life they choose, taking responsibility and positive risks to live life to the full.

What type of person makes a great Supported Living Buddy?

A great Supported Living Buddy is passionate about supporting people with learning disabilities to make positive choices. Our Buddies should also be outgoing, with excellent communication skills and a caring, patient nature.

At **halow**, we will consider applications from anyone who demonstrates a genuine desire to gain experience working within a charitable organisation and to work with young people with a learning disability. Although experience of working within a similar environment would be advantageous it isn't essential as full training will be provided.
