- Supporting the young person with their housekeeping duties such as cooking, grocery shopping or cleaning
- Assisting and encouraging the young person to gain as much independence as possible and to help them exercise as much choice in their daily lives as they are able to

What type of person makes a great Buddy?

Typically, a great Buddy would be someone with excellent communication skills, a positive attitude and passion for helping others.

What experience do I need to be a Buddy?

In short, you don't, as full training will be provided although previous experience working with young people with learning disabilities would be an advantage.
