



# Parent-Child Home Programme is designed to build school readiness where it starts: the home





#### **About PCHP**

PCHP supports the home-learning environment by working closely with parent and child and aims to increase school readiness, improve social-emotional skills and increase a family's engagement with appropriate services and social networks.

It is delivered in the home through twice-weekly visits, for up to **two years** by trained home visitors (either paid or volunteer).

Every family receives at least **92 home visits** over the course of the programme. PCHP addresses a range of outcomes for parents, including a child's cognitive gains, social and emotional gains, and home environment outcomes.







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#### **PCHP** benefits

- □ Supports 2-3 year olds from low-income families for two years
- Books and toys provided are developmentally appropriate and given to the family
- Well-trained, supervised staff/volunteers are role models for the family



- Emphasis is on the critical role of parent-child interaction in strengthening families and preparing children for school and success in life
- PCHP is delivered by community-based early literacy specialists who know the community and its resources.







### What happens on PCHP?

- □ Structured 15 month programme twice weekly
- □ Up to 92 visits
- □ Trained home visitors (either staff or volunteers)
- □ Free toys and books



- Guide sheets
- □ Home language
- □ Site Coordinator
- Home visitors receive initial and ongoing training and supervision





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#### **Does PCHP work?**

PCHP has a strong evidence base of effectiveness in the US. Children on the programme:

- are 50 per cent more likely to measure ready for kindergarten
- score 2.5 times higher on social-emotional skills assessment than their peers



 enter school performing 10 months above their chronological age.

#### **Delivering PCHP in your area**

PCHP is an ideal programme to support those families who are not accessing the free two-year-old childcare entitlement, and who are at risk of entering school significantly behind their peers.

#### **Apply to deliver PCHP**

We are able to offer 10 areas subsidised training to deliver PCHP using volunteers. The training will start in October/November 2018.

Cost of training, licence, two years' support and certification is normally £7,000 per site. We have subsidies of up to 50% available.

# You will need to be able to commit to the following to be eligible:

- Deliver PCHP to at least 20 families in your area, starting within 3 months of the training
- Employ one or more co-ordinators to oversee delivery and manage volunteers. (This could be part of an existing role or a new post. If a new role, it is recommend that they manage no more than 25 volunteers)
- Recruit, train and supervise 20 volunteers who will deliver PCHP
- Fund the books and toys which are left with the families (average cost per family for books and toys is £290)
- Funding volunteer travel expenses

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# You will need to maintain fidelity to the PCHP principles which includes:

- Twice weekly home visits to families for 30 minutes, for at least 46 weeks
- Visits involve the parent and child
- Each visit models positive parent-child interaction, positive behaviours and language/literacy skill development
- A home visiting record is kept of each visit (case notes)
- Books and toys that are brought to the homes are the curricular materials and gifts to the families
- The service is evaluated using two scales: Child Behavioural Traits (CBT) and Parent and Child Together (PACT)
- Ongoing professional development is
  promoted through weekly staff meetings









#### What you will receive:

- Use of evidence-based PCHP materials
- Three-day training for co-ordinators
- All technical, administrative and curricular materials needed to implement PCHP (including DVDs, manuals, forms, assessment tools, and other materials to be used in training and implementing the programme)
- Intensive technical assistance by telephone, by e-mail, through additional written materials, and in-person during site visits
- Implementation support for two years
- Networking and peer-learning with other PCHP sites
- Permission to reproduce and use all the PCHP Inc. copyrighted technical, curricular, and administrative materials.
